



A Pentecostal Experience

ACTS 2:1-14

"When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. And divided tongues as of fire appeared to them and rested on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit gave them utterance." (Acts 2:1-4)

SERMON NOTES:

While there is only one Pentecost, the spirit of Pentecost should never die. What was born on that magnificent day birthed the Church. Fifty days after Easter and through two main events, Pentecost officially introduced the Holy Spirit into the lives of Christ-followers.
